Eastrington Playing Fields and Recreation Trust	Funding towards the installation of a multi-use games area, for playing a variety of sports, aimed at all ages but particularly at young people.	10000
Gilberdyke Phoenix FC	Funding to purchase a GreenTek "Maxi-Brush" - a piece of ground maintenance equipment attached to & pulled behind a quad. Benefits include removing water prior to mowing and improving both the look and health of grass.	4000
Gilberdyke War Memorial Hall and playing fields	Funding to assist with the installation of a heat pump which will keep the annexe and small hall more comfortable in winter and summer, and reduce heating bills at the same time. The small hall is currently in use by the Gilberdyke Coronavirus Volunteer group who are providing help with food and running errands for people who are sheltering from the virus.	3412
Howden Young Farmers Club	Funding would contribute towards costs associated with activities, guest speakers and meetings.	2000
Eastrington Village Hall Association	Funding to replace the fire exit door for the stage and to install new blinds in the main hall.	1250
Gilberdyke & District Leisure Association	Funding to purchase two picnic tables for outdoor use.	1000
The Ashes Playing Field Trust, Howden	Funding to purchase an outdoor table tennis table and build a concrete base for it stand on.	1000
Gilberdyke Cricket Club	Funding to improve the scoring facilities at the club through the installation of a "score hut". Also to purchase a tablet to assist with live scoring.	750
