THE LOCAL FUND for the Harrogate District

An introduction

THE LOCAL FUND for the Harrogate District provides a sustainable source of funding for charitable and community organisations. Local groups can apply for funding for activities and services that support people, keeping them connected to their community and with each other. Projects provide long term benefit to local people and the communities they live in.

THE LOCAL FUND for the Harrogate District addresses needs of local people in the area around issues like:

- inequality and hidden poverty
- · loneliness and social isolation
- · health and wellbeing

Where the fund comes from

THE LOCAL FUND was kickstarted thanks to the generous support of the then Harrogate Borough Council. It has also been funded by the Harrogate Bolland Trust Fund, proceeds from THE LOCAL LOTTO and other local donors including businesses and individuals, which enables grants to be awarded each year.

Panels making the decisions of THE LOCAL FUND are made up of local leaders, the council and local people with direct experience of the issues affecting communities in the district.

In 2023 £92,828 was awarded in 39 grants, supporting 36 organisations. This was made up of two panels in February and September.



The area the fund supports

In April 2023 local government boundaries changed in North Yorkshire. However, the area of benefit for THE LOCAL FUND remains the area that was formerly Harrogate District and includes the towns of Harrogate, Knaresborough, Boroughbridge, Ripon, Masham, Pateley Bridge and the rural areas between. This geographical area reflects who made donations into the fund, and the places and communities they wanted to benefit.



The reach of Two Ridings

Through working with Two Ridings, THE LOCAL FUND reaches locally trusted organisations, led and delivered by people with lived and working experiences of the issues being funded.

It has allowed support for both long standing organisations and newly emergent community groups, confident that we understand their respective challenges and strengths. The fund has supported organisations working in both rural areas and local towns often overlooked by national funders


The groups and people supported

Of the 36 groups funded, 8 were first time applicants and 3 groups received funding in both rounds of grant making. All the groups are small local charities with on average 1.3 full time staff, 4 part time staff and 4 volunteers.

Just over 50% of groups have an annual income of under £100,000, 15% under £200,000 and none of the organisations supported by THE LOCAL FUND have an annual income of over £500,000

A wide range of people were supported by the funding including people living in poverty, people experiencing homelessness, children and young people, families, older people, people with disabilities, people in hospital, women who have suffered domestic abuse and those people who are rurally isolated.

Funded organisations

Artizan Harrogate: Funding towards staff, craft supplies and refreshments for craft and socialising opportunities for children and teens with Special Educational Needs, alongside support for their parents. £2,688

Badapple Theatre Company: Funding towards staff, hall hire, DBS checks and training to run youth session in the rural area of the Ure Valley, and to enable them to earn a recognised award. £1,580

Bilton Dragon Bowling Club: Funding towards a sprinkler system to make water use more efficient and to support club members with maintenance. £1,000

Boroughbridge and District Community Care: Funding towards staff and room hire to train befriending volunteers for people experiencing bereavement, or living with dementia or disabilities, for recently recruited, existing and to-be recruited volunteers. £3,000

Claro Enterprises, Starbeck: Funding towards staff, insurance and utilities to run community workshop to support people with mental health difficulties to improve their health and wellbeing. £3,000

FOCUS ON

Dales and Bowland CIC, GARGRAVE - £3,000

The Dales and Bowland CIC are using their funding to enable the continued provision of bus service 24 between Harrogate and Pateley Bridge on Sundays and Bank Holidays throughout the year.

It will serve the villages of Hampsthwaite, Birstwith, Darley, Dacre Banks and Summerbridge together with smaller communities along the route, with three journeys running in each direction, and will connect with other buses at Pateley Bridge during the summer months.

Reduced fares will enable young people aged under 19 to travel for as little as £1 per journey and older/disabled people with bus passes will benefit from free travel.

The service will help to connect the communities of Harrogate and Nidderdale, boosting people's mental wellbeing and physical health, as well as tackling social isolation/loneliness and social exclusion due to a lack of private transport.

Dales and Bowland CIC: Funding towards running a rural bus service on Sundays and Bank Holidays. £3,000

Dancing for Wellbeing: Funding towards operational costs, including a Dance Movement Therapist, for a trial series of sessions to support those who care for family members with dementia, to support carer's own needs. £1,200

Darley Playing Field Association: Funding towards outdoor play equipment for children in rurally isolated village. £3,000

Harlow Hill Community Centre Association: Funding towards new doors to improve the carbon footprint and look of community building. £2,000

Harrogate and District Community Action: Funding towards staff and room hire to support befriending and signposting services for older members of the community, particularly the weekly club and where some clients have more complex needs. £3,000

Harrogate Hospital Radio: Funding to purchase radios to lend to lonely inpatients in the Harrogate area hospitals. £1170



Inspire Youth Yorkshire: Funding for staff and overheads towards free weekly youth activities. £3,000

Jennyruth Workshops: Funding for staff and travel costs to offer workers with learning disabilities outreach opportunities, including sales at local shows, visits to stockists and delivering talks to other local groups. Also towards Jennryruth branded t-shirts and fleeces to provide new workers with learning disabilities pride in their work, and being able to represent the organisation at events. £3,000 & £1,500

Kairos Network Church: Funding towards a sprinkler system to make water use more efficient and to support club members with maintenance. £1.000

Knaresborough Museum Association: Funding towards staff and room hire to train befriending volunteers for people experiencing bereavement, or living with dementia or disabilities, for recently recruited, existing and to-be recruited volunteers. £1.500

Knot Another Choir: Funding towards staff, insurance and utilities to run community workshop to support people with mental health difficulties to improve their health and wellbeing. £3,000

Lifeline Harrogate: Funding for fruit and veg boxes (subsidised by the provider) to provide a healthy equivalent to crisis loans for food, to people who have recently experienced homelessness and are now accommodated in supported housing. Also for food and room hire for fortnightly lunch club, to support current and former residents of supported accommodation. £2,400 & £2,600

Living Potential Care Farming: Funding for tools, raised beds, compost and seeds to start therapeutic sessions in the walled garden for people living with mental health difficulties. £1,740

Low Harrogate Crown Green Bowling Club: Funding to buy bowls and equipment which will make the club more inclusive and to review the irrigation system. £2,250

Masham Community Office: Funding towards purchasing the organisation's premises to secure it as a community asset. £3.000

New Beginnings Peer Support: Funding towards staff, volunteers, materials etc for workshops looking at selfworth, boundaries and resilience, to increase the health and wellbeing of families, especially children. £2,690

Nidderdale Fell & Trail: Funding for staff and overheads towards free weekly youth activities. £3,000

Nidderdale Plus Partnership: Funding for three months of Digital Champion Coordinator time to continue to run project to support older people to be safe and confident online, and to stay connected. £3,000

Open Country: Funding for staff, volunteer costs, and operational costs towards running an allotment and tree nursery to offer skills development, mental health benefits and social activities for people with disabilities. Also for an accessible minibus, and allotment rent to ensure members can access mixed gardening and outdoor activities.

£3,000 & £2,450

Pateley Bridge & Bewerley Memorial Hall: Funding towards extending a local social event by opening for longer, and to offer hot food for the first time as part of the group becoming a warm space, for older people in a rurally isolated areas. £1,000

Pinewoods Conservation Group: Funding towards tools and PPE to create a new volunteer group to care for the woodland and to support volunteer's health and wellbeing. £2.410





Reflect: Funding for staff, volunteer costs and overheads to publicise support and to increase face to face sessions for people experiencing pregnancy and baby loss, and for those seeking post-termination support. £2,800

Ripon City Festival Trust: Funding to support teenagers to engage more with their local community and to address self-care and mental health, by experiencing live theatre themed around wellbeing, taking part in drama workshops and volunteering to encourage other young people to take part in the Festival. £1,800

Ripon Disability Forum: Funding to set up a website, particularly to create an interactive route mapping tool, that people with disabilities can design their own travel routes into and around Ripon and the surrounding area. £2,940

Samaritans of Harrogate and District: Funding towards volunteer expenses, operational costs and overheads for organisation seeking to reduce the number of people dying by suicide. £3,000

Supporting Older People CIO: Funding for staff, DBS checks, publicity to recruit and train befriender volunteers to support older people, and to start a new social group for older residents. £2,940

FOCUS ON

Taking Baby Steps CIC, Ripon - £2,530

"From some of the clients we have met, we recognise that rural isolation can exacerbate feelings of loneliness and existing mental health issues, which can be particularly difficult for new parents or those who sadly didn't get to bring a baby home.

"We are developing our services focusing on women and their partners in the perinatal period, seeking additional support who live in Ripon, Boroughbridge, and surrounding villages in North Yorkshire.

"The grant will fund therapeutic support sessions for those who have experienced pregnancy loss. We will also provide partially funded places for anyone requiring other elements of our one to one services." Taking Baby Steps CIC, Knaresborough: Funding for staff, travel expenses and sundries to be able to run community drop in groups as a pilot in rural areas, for parents facing pregnancy loss, baby loss, or peri- and post- natal mental health problems in more rural areas of the Harrogate district. £2,530

The Trauma Centre: Funding towards staff to support the running of heavily subsidised self-help evening classes for people with mental health difficulties, which would help reduce the need for more intensive therapy. £3,000

The Wellness Gateway CIC, Ripon: Funding staffing, to set up a trial Wellness Hub to offer mental health support and signposting in Ripon and surrounding areas. £3,000

Village Voices Killinghall: Funding towards a keyboard and accessories to be able to keep rurally isolated village choir running for years to come. £640

Wellspring Therapy & Training: Funding towards volunteer travel expenses, to be able to offer more counselling sessions and reduce waiting times for people to support people with poor mental health, experiencing family problems and more. £3,000





FOCUS ON

Artizan, Harrogate

The young people at Artizan experienced extreme social isolation as a result of the pandemic and dwindling social care support, Artizan wanted to offer more free creative workshops and isolation busting opportunities for them to come together for friendship and support.

Their crafty Llama group is a weekly after school club specifically designed for children aged 8-12 with special needs.

The children develop their creative skills and make friends in a supportive environment whilst their parents benefit from a coffee and signposting support

Their Llama Lounge SEN youth club is a vital socialising opportunity for teens with special needs that are amongst the most isolated of disabled groups.

When their able peers are busy with part time jobs and activities, young people at Artizan are often left behind. The Artizan youth club is a place they can hang out with friends, game, switch on a big screen, dance under the disco ball and take part in a range of games that are often not available to neuro diverse and disabled young people.

Again, there is a support element for the parents attending, where they can access moral support together and useful signposting for funding or activities and partner organisations.











"The trauma from the pandemic and now the cost of living crisis has not gone away. We see loneliness and mental health issues are off the scale. Our funding has been used to build up the self-worth and resilience of the people we support, increasing the wellbeing of all the family.

"Funding has been crucial over the years for us and without THE LOCAL FUND, and other funding from Two Ridings, we would not be able to do what we do for people. We are so grateful."
